Beginning October 1, 2012, all AHCCCS provider agencies of direct care services (attendant care, personal care or homemaker services) must utilize DCWs who have passed the required competency tests within 90 days of hire unless otherwise exempt from the training and testing requirements (e.g. Registered Nurse, Licensed Practical Nurse and Certified Nurse Aide).

Milieu treatment is an important factor in children's mental health care, particularly with regard to group care settings. The most recent data indicate that more than 25% of children receiving mental health services in 1997 were treated in this type of setting (United States Department of Mental Health - Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, 2002). While there is a paucity of research investigating the efficacy of milieu treatment programs, the data reviewed indicate favorable results. Literature on milieu treatment with children and adolescents, however, dates back approximately 60 years. Cotton (1993), Gunderson (1978), and Miskimins (1990), provide conceptual frameworks for structuring a milieu and for implementing therapeutic practices of milieu treatment. In addition to providing the architecture for obtaining desirable treatment outcomes, each of the authors highlights milieu staff members' roles and suggests ideal characteristics of the staff. Moreover, these authors and several others assert that direct care staff members should be well trained, although none of the works specifies a training protocol for direct care personnel. The present work consists of the development of a training manual for direct care staff that can be applied to child or adolescent populations being treated in inpatient psychiatric hospitals, residential treatment programs, or clinical day treatment programs. The training manual is developed from an integration of both milieu treatment literature and the literature supporting three growing trends in children's mental health care. These include: the use of strength-based interventions, reduction in the use of restraint/seclusion (R/S), and the implementation of trauma-sensitive treatment. The training is designed to be implemented by a mental health professional who serves as the director of clinical services within the group care facility. The training also includes strategies for the administrator to facilitate the transfer of learning into daily practice. The implications and limitations of this training, as well as areas of future research are discussed.

Clinicians from many disciplines have been challenged to provide appropriate and effective interventions for the diverse behavioral symptoms that define the neurologically degenerative condition, dementia. SLPs have only recently begun to develop assessment and treatment approaches for the cognitive and communication deficits that accompany dementia. This timely volume aims to serve as a reference manual and the starting point for those who want to provide life-enhancing services to persons with dementia, and to inspire the continued generation of quality research to demonstrate the value of cognitive-communication intervention. Students, researchers, and practitioners in all areas of communication sciences and disorders will find this book immensely helpful.

Although we speak of "the elderly" as if there were one body of people with common characteristics, older adults are more heterogeneous than any other population. People over the age of 65 are also the fastest-growing segment of the population in the United States, currently numbering 25 million. The majority of older adults reside in their communities; a small fraction of them are cared for in institutions. Most may expect to experience some kind of physical impairment. Approximately a quarter of the population may expect to suffer amental health impairment. While traditional therapies have not been especially effective for older adults, behavior therapy has shown exceptional promise as a treatment modality. This book presents a comprehensive explication of the relatively new field of behavioral gerontology. It was written for the clinician interested in the interaction of medical, environmental, and psychological variables and their effects on treatment of elderly clients and for the researcher who will be looking to extend knowledge about interventions with this population. It will be useful for the graduate student in clinical psychology, as well as the experienced clinician, who will want to include the elderly in his or her therapeutic population.
