Countable Nouns. As their name suggests, countable nouns are those that refer to something that can be counted. For example, we can count cars: one car, two cars, three cars... Even if the number might be extraordinarily high (like counting all the stars in the sky), countable nouns can be individually counted.

Here are 10 uncountable nouns related to food, suitable for elementary learners. Nouns are either countable or uncountable: if a noun is countable we can count it; if a noun is uncountable we can't count it. Uncountable nouns can't have a number before them. We cannot say: one meat, two breads, three creams.
